Safe School and Bully Prevention

Everyone at Sunnyside works hard to make this school a safe place for all students. Emergency response practices including Lockdown and Fire Drill help all of learn how to act in a crisis. Through classroom lessons and regular interventions on the playground we are helping student to continually improve their social skills and develop strategies to prevent aggressive behaviour. Parents are reminded to inform the school right away if your child comes home and reports that he/she has been hurt by another student. We follow through on all reports and are constantly monitoring behaviour. Communication is the best form of prevention.

Reading is Essential

Reading is an absolute must at all ages. At Sunnyside we start teaching children to read their letters in pre-K and Kindergarten and continue with advanced reading comprehension all the way through Cycle 3.

Parents: keep reading with your child; it is one of the best ways for children of all ages to improve reading skills and vocabulary.

Healthy Snacks

Thank you for sending healthy snacks for your child, such as fruit, vegetables, and some protein such as boiled eggs, cheese, yogurt, or even half a sandwich. Nutrition has an impact on student learning and we all want the best for our children and students.

Shoes
